



Ticket Policy

Our return to normal recitals includes an adjustment back to a more standard recital ticket policy, which is as follows:

1. **Ticket Sales:** All recital tickets should be purchased online at georgiadance.com at the price of \$15/ticket. You do not need a code to purchase your tickets.
2. **Back to Full Capacity:** Unlike last year, ticket sales will not be limited... bring as many family members and friends as you would like! All audience members older than 2 will need a ticket for admission.
3. **Assigned Seating:** Another update we think you'll appreciate— seats will be specifically designated via assigned seating (selected when you purchase tickets online), which means avoiding the chaos and stress of finding seats when the doors open.

Some questions you may have:

- Are recital tickets included as part of the recital performance fee?
 - Recital tickets are not included as part of the Recital Performance Fee. The Recital Performance fee is a separate fee that goes toward covering the (rapidly increasing) costs of the facility and equipment rental, as well as the additional skilled labor required to run our six recital performances as professionally and safely as possible for our dancers, faculty, staff, and audience members.
- Oops, I purchased tickets for the wrong show. What should I do?
 - On the ticketing page, scroll down to the bottom and on the right hand side you will see "Customer Service". Click the "FAQs and Contact Info" and choose the option "It's something else, I need to call." From there you will be connected with a team member from the ticketing company
- Last year we were given three free tickets. Why has this changed?
 - A lot of things were different for last year's recital, including our ticket policy. In order to ensure we only had facility mandated capacity of 175 (or less) audience members per show, as well as to ensure each dancer in the show had a fair allotment of tickets (minimum of 3) for their friends and families, we used a ticket coupon code system. This was a difficult decision, as it meant many family members or close friends could not attend a very special performance for their dancer. To soften the blow of all things COVID-19 did not allow us to do last year, and as a sign of goodwill to the families and dancers who danced through COVID with us, we offered the allotted three tickets free of charge.
